NZ Government	<p>The Cyclone Gabrielle Appeal</p> <p>Cyclone Gabrielle is the most significant weather event New Zealand has experienced this century. From Cape Reinga in the far north down to the Tararuas and the Wairarapa, the extreme weather events at the start of 2023 have devastated so many communities. Lives, homes and businesses have been lost, and there is a long road ahead for many New Zealanders.</p> <p>The Cyclone Gabrielle Appeal was launched by Prime Minister Chris Hipkins to help to communities rebuild. It will ensure that local and international donations are channelled back to the communities and projects that need them the most. Work and Income	<p>Civil Defence Payments</p> <p>Civil Defence Payments are available for people who have been affected by the flooding. You don't have to be on a benefit to qualify for a Civil Defence Payment, and non- residents may be eligible.
