What we delivered this year

Te Pūaha o te Ako continued to grow its offering - delivering across webinars, insights resources, leadership development and systems change. We launched paid public events for the first time which opened space for deeper sector engagement with healing and restorative systems change practice.



7 Impact and insights resources

Spotlight on two insights resources:

- Te Tiriti information disorder – exploring how mis-, dis- and malinformation affect our understanding of Te Tiriti o Waitangi, why this matters to philanthropy, and what it means for organisations commitment to honouring it.
- Sharpening an equity focus in philanthropy - considering how philanthropic funders can be more intentional and strategic in pursuit of their social equity goals.

Refreshed our two most-used web resources:

- The Funding Guide and Core Skills Toolkit – including integrating insights from community sector practitioners.



15 Te Pūaha Talks webinars

Our 15 Te Pūaha Talks spanned a wide range of topics, with a dedicated series bringing our Core Skills Toolkit resources to life.

- New this year - 1:1 coaching sessions following selected talks to deepen participant learning. They told us the combination of webinar learning and personalised support made a real difference.

- 1 x Haumanu facilitation wānanga
- 1 x scaling deep conference presentation
- 5 x supervision sessions for Haumanu facilitators

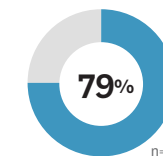
