Useful data

A plan for the next 3 years to constantly gather and review data to measure, track, understand and communicate our impact

Is hard to measure our impact on the community because it can not be measure by data. only to a certain extend

Ways to meaningfully measure impact which 'costs' the least to resource

How do we keep it simple, actionable but still meaningful

Tools for measuring impact Ideas for how to present findings When/how often to measure impact, i.e. how often?

- Developing a clear / concise / accessible evaluation framework- Articulating this framework in a way that others can understand and engage with- Prioritising what to evaluate first
