The COVID-19 Leave Support is paid as a lump sum, calculated to cover 2 weeks. <b>COVID-19 Resurgence Support Payment</b>	<p>The Resurgence Support Payment (RSP) is a payment to help support viable and ongoing businesses or organisations due to a COVID-19 alert level increase to level 2 or higher. <b>COVID-19 Short-term Absence Payment</b>	<p>If you're staying at home because you're waiting on a COVID-19 test result and you cannot work from home, your employer could apply for the COVID-19 Short-term Absence Payment. This payment is also available to self-employed people.</p> <p>A one-off payment of \$350 is available for each employee. Your employer can apply for it once for you in any 30-day period.
